



About EAGLES Award

- EAGLES Award is only eligible to **Singapore Citizens**. The number of EAGLES nominees is up to **15%** of total enrolment of Singaporeans in the school. That is about **150** students.
- The value of award is \$350 per student.
- Nomination period: 24 July to 22 August 2025

Who can qualify?

Students **must** meet the following criteria:

- 1) Singapore Citizen
- 2) At least a "Good" Conduct Grade (with no attendance, late-coming or disciplinary issues)
- Role model
- Good attendance for CCA and school
- Preferably Upper secondary student
- The nomination is for the student's work/achievement attained in this year (2024).

Must at least attained at least a Level 3 in LEAPS 2.0

Who can nominate?

- Form Teachers (for projects conducted at class levels)

- CCA Teachers (for projects conducted at CCA level)
- Classmates / peers

Service Category (VIA)

- Organised VIA projects and have contributed significantly to the projects.
- CHAMPS projects / Class Free Day (VIA projects) / co-organised events by Sec 3 classes such as the Teachers' Day Celebrations, NDP celebrations, Graduation Day, etc
- Eg 1) Student A was enthusiastic in providing suggestions to the project and active in working with her team to conduct the activities. She took the lead in guiding her committee in garnering support from the school community in donating the items for the project.
- Eg 2) Student B participated actively in organising the VIA project to raise the community's awareness of the bushfire situation in Australia and started a donation drive in getting the community to buy bags to support the course.

Service Category (CCA – exemplary contribution)

Enthusiastic about their CCA activities and **contributed significantly** to their CCA, by:

- (a) guiding their peers;
- (b) improved/value-added by being an active member
- (c) **should not** have a leadership post recognised under LEAPS 2.0

Service Category (CCA – exemplary contribution)

- Eg 1) Student A supports the Executive Committee in running the CCA.
 He has been appointed the warm-up and drill IC for the lower secondary students, mentoring them in basic routines.
- Eg 2) Student C is always punctual for his CCA duties and actively guides his peers/juniors in their duties by teaching them how to use the PA system.
- Eg 3) Student D suggested the idea for her CCA to keep the school environment clean and worked with her CCA members to encourage the school community to keep the school environment clean.
- Eg 4) Student B has made significant progress in the mastery of skills and/or knowledge which enabled contributions to the co-curricular programme beyond the individual level.
